Maintenance Works

The community is asked to seek an alternative route while renewal works are undertaken on the Lake Benalla Boardwalk (on the Art Gallery side).

The boardwalk path is currently closed from the bridge underpass on the Gallery side of the lake. Pedestrians will need to use the alternate route over Bridge Street.

Once this section is completed, further renewal works will take place on the boardwalk alongside the Gallery. Pedestrians will need to detour around this area during this time.

Council will use an environmentally friendly material in the boardwalk upgrade, one that utilises waste wood and recycled plastic.

This project is funded by the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.
